

City plans fueling station for electric vehicles

Forsyth city council will put a fueling station for electric vehicles near the square after council voted Monday to partner with Middle Georgia Clean Air Coalition in the proposal. The station will fuel two vehicles at a time. Middle Georgia Clean Air Coalition will provide up to \$5,000 for a 50-50 match with the city, but the station is only expected to cost about \$7,600.

Mayor Eric Wilson told council he and city manager Janice Hall attended the Middle Georgia Clean Air Coalition meeting about the fueling stations after he learned that Forsyth was on the group's list of five sites where it wants to put stations. Forsyth will be the first refueling station south of McDonough. The other four prospective sites in Middle Georgia are at Mercer University, which has already committed, and at the Zebulon Road theater, Warner Robins Air Museum and the Peach Outlet Mall.
